Research your state's most recent legislation on capital punishment.	Contact your state and federal legislators to express your opposition to capital punishment.	Encourage others to participate with you in a campaign to abolish the death penalty.
Consider how race, poverty, age, and mental health are factors in death sentences.	Support youth at risk by mentoring. Support inmate programs that assist with transitioning to civilian life.	Speak out on the value of restorative rather than retaliative justice.
Learn about <i>For Whom the Bells Toll</i> , <a href="http://bells.curenational.org">http://bells.curenational.org</a>	Pray for those being executed.	Organize a community response, toll bells, hang a banner, include names of executed in bulletin.
